When it comes time to write these newsletters, it feels as though we are being pulled two different directions. To rejoice in what the Lord did this summer, but also not sugar coating or ignoring the trials and struggles that were there. I believe Ruthie said it best, while looking back to the summer : "We lived through a miracle."

As we look back on the summer, we can clearly see how the Lord came through, as the gaps and holes were so big.

The staff this summer was young, many of them just 18. This resulted in us being low on adults, having to do many swaps and changes to ensure we had a 19+ individual at many of the needed places at camp to run program. These adults who came poured out for the mission in amazing ways, fighting through tiredness, injuries, sickness, and heat.

On the flip side of that, we saw amazing growth, emotionally and spiritually, in those young staff members. They rose up to meet the challenge that was before them, putting their faith into action and meeting God in amazing ways.

Another place with a hole was the kitchen. In May, June, and even through July and August, we didn't know how it was going to work. Last year we were faced with the reality that without cabin leaders, campers can't come. This summer we were another leader and a program staff.) faced with the fact that though we had cabin leaders, without food those campers can only stay so long.

Ruthie worked long hours all through those months... though looking back we can now see that she was rarely alone. Sometimes it was through having extra SEEDs, other times through individuals who could come for just a day or two. And then there were those who came for a month at a time.

The burden was still great. And one of the other ways we see the miraculous working of God this summer is how He sustained Ruthie, keeping her from the many camp sicknesses that ran rampant through the team.

And on the flip side of the uncertainty that we walked through, never knowing who would be in the kitchen or even if we would have the help needed to feed the next program or camp... we saw God bring willing people, who we pray will take that spark for camp back into their communities. That the struggle we engaged with allowed them the space to taste and see the amazing work God is doing here.

Even in that place that we stood in during May and June, and then even much of the summer, the Lord gave a blessing our last week of camp. He provided extra hands...

and Ruthie was able to step out of the kitchen for 27 hours and cabin



lead one of our taster cabins with another leader and 10 delightful girls. (Though she did go and cook breakfast that Thursday morning, leaving the girls sleeping with

How amazing is our God? Not only did He provide the help that we needed, but He gave extra hands and energy to those who were there, giving the gift of a chance for Ruthie to cabin lead.

And this is the testimony of many staff this summer. That while the burden was heavy, there is no denying that, God came through in miraculous ways.

The Lord is truly good! His provision is perfect and we look forward to seeing it continue to unfold as the fiscal year closes in October, and we move into a new season in 2024.

-Generous donors to both capital and operating expenses inspire us to keep moving forward and seeing the potential in the facilities the Lord supplies.

-A challenge this year has been the absence of funding historically provided by the Canada Summer Job's grant. The grant application was not successful this year and it has left a gap in anticipated funding of about \$37,000.

-Other general maintenance, as highlighted in this Newsletter, added an additional \$10,000 to the budget – the work was well needed, but is un funded at this time.

Even as this is being written, we believe the Lord is moving amongst His people in support of His work here at Sagitawa, and we are humbled by the responsibility He places on us to use those resources carefully. If you are thinking of additional giving, know that General Fund donations will be used where the need is greatest, but, with the shift to directly paying more positions, money previously earmarked for the "Bursary Fund" can be donated to the "Staff Fund" to support those wages.

"It was a summer of doing as God asked and learning to daily trust and lean on Him."


"Even though it was hard sometimes, I was able to accomplish the tasks given to me through the support of the team around me."
