Financial Update:

Last update we noted that we had written and submitted a number of grant requests. Of the three requests, The South Peace Mackenzie Trust application was granted as requested – now we have to buckle in and get the staff housing addition done! The Regional District continues to be good supporters of our initiatives and our request was granted at half the funding requested. The Lord continues to answer our prayers with those funding sources, and multiplies your steadfast giving! The Canada Summer Jobs application has been granted, but also at about half of the amount requested. This will be a gap in our funding expectations.

We are blessed by your gifts small and large – financial or time; It reminds us that we walk together with Christ in carrying out the mission He has here at Sagitawa. In this odd economic environment we find ourselves – low unemployment, high cost of living – we continue to receive applications for camper sponsorships; a great line item in the budget to contribute to, to directly get campers here, listening to the Gospel!

As we have previously mentioned we are seeing Summer 2024 come together! Praise the Lord for the good plan He has in store for the summer!

Campers are registering, eager to be at camp.

K2 is completely full and K3 is waitlisting for girl campers. It is amazing to see all these kids and youth excited to come to camp, where we get to share with them the love of God...

through specific teaching times but also through how we live life together.

We are also seeing the cycle continue of individuals from our SEED program move onto the staff team. It is a blessing to watch these young adults year after year as they have come from campers, to SEEDs, and now to staff. To think back on all the different conversations and times of wrestling or conflict that we walked through with them. We've seen the Lord work in mighty ways in each of their lives. It can be easy to get caught up in looking at the positions not yet filled... but the Lord is calling people. And they are responding.
